

FOOD SERVICE STAFF DRESS CODE

In addition to the dress expectations of Southern New Hampshire Services, Inc. and the Child Development Program, Food Service Staff are expected to adhere to these additional requirements for safety and sanitation reasons while in the kitchens or handling food.

Jewelry-Jewelry is limited to one plain wedding band on the hands. No bracelets or watches on the wrists. No necklaces. Earrings can be studs or hoops smaller than a penny. No large earrings or earrings with dangling pieces.

Hair Restraint- Hair must be pulled back and covered at all times in the kitchen. Hair can be covered with a ball cap, bandana, hair net or other clean hair restraint. Facial hair will be covered with a beard restraint.

Clothing- Food service staff must wear clean clothing daily covered by an apron. Aprons should be removed when leaving the kitchen (i.e. when going to the restroom, outside, etc.). Food service staff will wear long pants, no shorts.

Footwear-Food service staff must wear rubber soled closed shoes.

Hands- fingernails are to be free of nail polish and artificial fingernails and kept short.
